



HELPING YOUR CHILD SETTLE

LEAVING YOUR CHILD:

To help your child adjust to Nursery and its environment, we suggest that on the first day, you leave them for only 1 – 2 hours. The transition for the children can take a few weeks and it is not unusual for a child to be upset even after 4 or 5 weeks. The easiest way to adjust both you and your child to the settling in period is to talk to your teacher over any concern so that we can work together as a team.

SNACK BOXES:

Healthy snack boxes are encouraged at all times, staff will assist with feeding the children but we prefer to encourage the children to eat independently therefore finger food is the best option. Some suggestions are sandwiches, chopped fruit and vegetables, cooked pasta/rice, yoghurt, crackers etc.

UNIFORM:

All children attending the Nursery must wear the school uniform which consists of shorts and polo shirt; you will be able to purchase this during the first week of the school term.

TIMINGS:

Drop off is from 8am till 9am, unless prior arrangements have been made with the Nursery. Children are expected to be collected at their finishing times, if you are going to be delayed please inform us as soon as possible and please note that any late collections will be charged. A fee for late pickups of Dhs50.00 for the first 15 minutes and thereafter Dhs100.00 per 30 minutes will be charged.

LABELLING:

Please make sure all items of clothing, bags, lunch boxes etc.. are clearly labelled with your child's name.

TOYS:

We try to discourage children from bringing toys from home just in case they get damaged or lost. If however your child has a favourite comfort toy, blanket etc.. you may pack this for the first few days, again please make sure this is clearly labelled.

SICKNESS:

Bringing a sick child to nursery can cause cross infection amongst the other children and staff. To control this situation any child coming to nursery that looks obviously unwell or becomes unwell during school time will be sent home until they are well enough to attend again.
